## MAKE SPECIAL NOTE:

1. Face Covering Update:
  - a. The CDC recommends that people wear cloth face coverings in public settings.
  - b. Cloth face coverings are recommend as a simple barrier to help prevent respiratory droplets from traveling into the air and onto other people when the person wearing the cloth face covering coughs, sneezes, talks, or raises their voice. This is called source control. It is not known if neck gaiters provide any benefit as source control to protect others from the spray of respiratory particles.

- c. **The CDC does not recommend use of neck gaiters as a substitute for cloth face coverings.** Neck gaiters should only be used until an appropriate cloth face covering can be secured.
- d. Students will have one week to secure an appropriate cloth face covering.
- 2. Morning Carline –proceed to follow the line after your child exits the vehicle. Do not exit the line until you reach the school sign area. Please use your turning signal when exiting the line. Our goal is to ensure everyone’s safety.
- 3. We ask that you make any appointments for your child after school or near the end of the day. Our goal is to prevent our students from being exposed to germs from others that may be obtained at a doctor’s office.
- 4. The children are encouraged to bring clear water bottles to school. Label the water bottle with your child’s first and last name. Metal bottles are acceptable. Please avoid bringing glass bottles to school. Please put extra water bottles in a lunch box. This will help to prevent water from leaking in the school bags.
- 5. There are several students in need of haircuts. The student handbook indicates that hairstyles should be neat, clean, and natural in color. Boy’s hair must not touch the eyebrows when combed straight down and must be above the ears. Boy’s hair must be above the collar of the uniform shirt. Boys may not wear ponytails, mohawks, long sideburns, facial hair, etc. Students will not be allowed to have extreme hair styles or coloring.
