Each Catholic school in the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux may submit UP TO 3 acts. Each should fit into one of the following categories:

- 3rd-5th Grade (Individual Acts)
- 3rd-5th Grade (Group Acts)
- 6th-8th Grade (Individual Acts)
- 6th-8th Grade (Group Acts)

*Group Acts = 2+ people on stage at once.

*Schools may submit more than one act per category. Schools may not exceed the 3 act total limit.

*It is up to each school to determine which 3 acts are registered representing their school.

- Acts are limited to 3 minutes. Registration fee for each act is \$10.
- No contestant may compete in two acts of the same category.
- Sound system and an electric keyboard will be provided. Other instruments must be provided by the contestant.
- Acts must consist of age-appropriate content; no foul language or obscene implications. Appropriate dress is required to perform.
- Music is to be turned in to Holy Savior School (in Disc/CD format) by Thursday, November 14th.
