Lent is the season in which we prepare for the celebration of Easter, the greatest feast of the church year. Lent is a time of prayer, fasting and giving. For 40 days, from Ash Wednesday until Holy Thursday, we pray, fast, and give alms to those in need. It is a time of reflection and appreciation for the redeeming love and mercy of God. Catholics may chose to "give up" things for Lent, but the Church strongly recommends positive Lenten practices ... daily Mass, works of mercy, personal prayer. It is a time to try harder to put Christ's teachings into practice.

Ash Wednesday is the first day of the season of Lent, and on this day, we mark our foreheads with ashes to signify that we repent our sinfulness and demonstrate our desire to change. During the season of Lent, we abstain, or refrain, from the eating of meat on Fridays as well as on Good Friday. Abstinence is meant to help us focus our attention on God, the true source of our nourishment. We turn our hearts toward God and toward the needs of others. Lent is an opportunity for us to grow and change, to follow Jesus' example of loving others.
