

Summer Reading Response: 5th (for the 2018-19 school year)

ALL PROJECTS DUE by AUGUST 6th, 2018

Students are required to participate in the Summer Reading Program. Summer reading counts as a major grade in the student's Language Arts class (Reading); therefore it is important that all students complete the required reading activities **prior to the first day of school.**

Requirements:

- ✓ 5th - Read at least **THREE (3)** books at your reading level – **"The Secret Garden"** ***Classic Starts*** retold from the Frances Hodgson Burnett original **by Martha Hailey must be one of the 3 books.** (for young readers specifically) (must purchase or borrow; must also have with supplies on August 6th to start school)
- ✓ 5th - Read/log a **minimum** of 900 minutes on your **Reading Log** AND at www.scholastic.com/summer

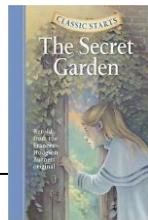
