... that we celebrated our first school mass today with Father Eric as the celebrant. At this time, only three grades will be attending mass in church and the rest of the school will participate through Zoom. Due to the current COVID restrictions, no visitors are allowed to attend School Mass in person. We ask that you join us in celebrating school masses live on Facebook. Thank you for your understanding!!

...that we had a great first full week of school. Thank you for your patience in adjusting to the new morning and afternoon car lines.

... that our first Family Mission project this year will be to help the Louis Children’s Crisis Center, a home for abused and neglected children in Houma, to outfit several of their children with needed uniforms, backpacks and other clothing for the school year. A sign-up will be sent out soon with items needed. Please choose an item or items to purchase and have your child drop them in the Family Mission Box that will be located in the school foyer. The items must be sent to school by Wednesday, September 2. Thanks for your generosity!

MAKE SPECIAL NOTE:

1. Morning Carline – please proceed to follow the line after your child exits the vehicle. Please do not exit the line until you reach the school sign area. Our goal is to ensure everyone’s safety.
2. Alumni Grill is featuring the “Patriot Patty” for the month of August. Proceeds from the Patriot Patty will be donated to St. Genevieve Catholic School. As of

Monday, 383 burgers were sold. Thanks for your support in advance. We would also like to thank Randy Landry Construction for being the burger of the month sponsor.

3. If your child is eating lunch from the cafeteria, it is important that he/she has money in their lunch account. Please contact Ms. Tiffany, our cafeteria manager, with any questions (985)-447-7756.
4. Picture envelopes were sent home today. The envelopes must be returned with payment on picture day, which is Tuesday. Parents may write one check, but every child needs to return an envelope.
5. Thursday is a fun dress and treat sale day.

"Fun Dress Days" are days when the students do not have to wear their uniforms. Traditionally there is one such day per month and is noted on the calendar. Halter, midriff, or tank tops are not acceptable for school days or school functions. Shorts worn alone must be to the knee. If shorts are not to the knee they must be worn with leggings or tights. Leggings or tights may not be worn alone. T-shirts and shorts with offensive slogans may not be worn. Tennis shoes must be worn.

Treat Sale Days are days when students can bring \$1.00 in an envelope marked with the child's name and class for a recess snack. The proceeds benefit the class sponsoring the treat sale.

6. Handbook contracts are due on Friday, August 28, 2020. The contract is located on the last page of the Student Handbook.
7. Friday is spirit shirt day. Students may substitute their uniform blouses and shirts with their **green** spirit shirts.
8. We ask that you make any appointments for your child after school or near the end of the day. Our goal is to prevent our students from being exposed to germs from others that may be obtained at a doctor's office.
9. YK through seventh grade students are asked to bring a pair of ear buds/head phones with a 3.5mm plug (no USB or Blue Tooth) to use for computer. These ear buds/head phones should be in a sealed plastic bag with your child's name. The students will leave the headphones in their school bag until it is time for computer.
10. The children are encouraged to bring clear water bottles to school. Label the water bottle with your child's first and last name. Metal bottles are acceptable. Please avoid bringing glass bottles to school. Please put extra water bottles in a lunch box. This will help to prevent water from leaking in the school bags.
11. There are several students in need of haircuts. The student handbook indicates that hairstyles should be neat, clean, and natural in color. Boy's hair must not touch the eyebrows when combed straight down and must be above the ears.

Boy's hair must be above the collar of the uniform shirt. Boys may not wear ponytails, mohawks, long sideburns, facial hair, etc. Students will not be allowed to have extreme hair styles or coloring.
